COURSE SYNOPSIS

This International Olympic Committee (IOC) course is a collaboration between the Singapore National Olympic Council (SNOC) and the Republic Polytechnic (RP).

This course delivers knowledge and skills that are organised into six themes, Sports Eco-System, Marketing and Sponsorship, Sports Science, Sports Events and Facilities Management, Sports Coaching, Careers in Sports. These are important building blocks to enhance the competencies of executives for the planning and delivery of sports programmes in schools, community or for commercial undertakings.

The continual upgrading of the knowledge and skills in these areas are becoming increasingly important to support the growth of the sports, health, and event management industry.

ASSESSMENT

Participants will have to complete an assignment for each module. These assignments are integrated to form a solution to highlight priorities to enhance the delivery system of the sport of their choice.

What would be awarded?

Participants will receive two certificates, one from the IOC and one from Republic Polytechnic respectively.

Participants must meet the required attendance of 75% and complete assignments in order to receive the certificates.

Who should attend?

Various stakeholders in the sports industry, including sports administrators from the National Sports Associations; educators and CCA leaders from schools and institutions of higher learning; executives from the public agencies dealing with community sports, private enterprises doing businesses for sports, coaches, etc.
